








St Benedict's Church once stood at one end of the Merchants' Bridge (near Benediktsplatz square), the counterpart of St Giles Church at the other end. It was demolished in 1895. The outline of the former church has been traced in natural stone at its original site. 

In 2025, a remarkable architectural monument is celebrating its 700th anniversary - the stunning Merchants' Bridge in Erfurt. A whole range of events and activities are taking place around the bridge throughout the year - come and join the celebrations!



Merchants' Bridge

This heritage-listed cultural monument is the longest bridge in Europe lined with houses along its entire span. Closely linked to the historical Via Regia trade route, the city of Erfurt was a vibrant trading hub in the Middle Ages.

The bridge was first mentioned in records in **1156** as pons rerum venalium – bridge of traded goods – and it remains a great place for leisurely window shopping to this day. All sorts of merchants and craftsmen used the bridge to transport or sell their wares, including traders, apothecaries and goldsmiths. Krämer is an old German word for merchant, which is why the bridge is known as Krämerbrücke in Germany.

History of the bridge
