Welcome!

The former Electoral-Mainzian Pack- und Waagehof from the early 18th century with its richly decorated magnificent facade is one of the most beautiful buildings in Erfurt's old town. Over a hundred years ago, in 1886, a picture gallery was opened here. From this, other special museums developed in a short time. Today, the Stadtpalast am Anger houses the art museum of the state capital Erfurt: Here, landscape paintings, still lifes and portraits from the 19th century to the present can be seen, as well as the largest collection of Thuringian faiences and arts and crafts. Prominent is the most important collection of medieval art from Erfurt and Thuringia with works of international rank. On the first floor is one of the few surviving murals of German Expressionism by Erich Heckel.

Overview

- Formerly the 18th century Kurmainz packing and weighing yard today the art museum of the state capital Erfurt with painting gallery, arts and crafts and collection of medieval art
- Public guided tours "Art break" on Wednesday 1 p.m.
- Parking facilities in the "Forum I" multi-storey parking lot
- Public transport: Anger stop all lines

Accessibility at a glance

- Building accessible without steps
- All rooms and facilities that can be used by guests and are elevated are accessible without steps or via an elevator
- 88 cm minimum width of all passages/doors
- WC for people with disabilities
- Assistance dogs welcome
- Guided tours for people with disabilities

Information for people with walking difficulties and wheelchair users

All areas relevant for testing meet the quality criteria of the label "Accessibility certified - accessible for people with walking disabilities and for wheelchair users".

Some **information on accessibility** are listed below. For detailed information please see the evaluation report.

- There is a public parking lot at 200 m distance (Hirschlachufer 86).
- The S-Bahn station "Anger" is 40 m away.
- The path in front of the entrance is easy to walk and drive on.
- The building is steplessly accessible via the main entrance.
- All evaluated rooms and facilities available to the guests are steplessly accessible at ground level or via an elevator.
- The elevator cabin measures 116 cm x 215 cm.
- Almost all evaluated passageways / doors available to the guests are at least 88 cm wide.
- The counter / cash desk is 111 cm high at its lowest point. There is another, equivalent communication possibility while in a sitting position.
- The exhibits are predominately visible while sitting.
- The information on the exhibits is predominately legible while sitting.
- Guided tours for people with walking impairments and wheelchair users are offered. A
 reservation in advance is necessary.
- Special trained guides ensure that people with walking impairments and wheelchair users can take part in any guided tour.
- The entire route of the guided tour is steplessly accessible for wheelchair users.

Public toilet for people with disabilities (basement)

- The maneuvering spaces are:
 in front of / behind the door, in front of the toilet and in front of the washbasin at least 150 cm x 150 cm:
 - left of the toilet 88 cm x 70 cm and right of the toilet 100 cm x 70 cm.
- There are handles which can be folded up on the right and left of the toilet.
- The sink is wheelchair accessible.
- The mirror can be seen while standing or sitting.
- An alarm trigger (cord, button) is present.

Information for people with hearing impairments and deaf people

Some **information on accessibility** are listed below. For detailed information please see the evaluation report.

- There is no clearly perceptible visual alarm.
- There is no audio induction loop.
- An outgoing emergency call in the elevator is confirmed acoustically. Stairs are available as an alternative.
- Information about the exhibits is provided in written form.
- Guided tours are offered for people with hearing disabilities, but not for deaf people. An advance reservation is necessary.

Information for visually impaired and blind people

All areas relevant for testing meet the quality criteria of the label "Accessibility certified - partially accessible for people with visual impairments".

Some **information on accessibility** are listed below. For detailed information please see the evaluation report.

- Assistance dogs are allowed in relevant areas / rooms.
- Outdoor paths do not have visually contrasting or tactilely detectable walkway boundaries.
- The entrance is visually rich in contrast and recognizable by a tactile change of floor covering.
- The signage is designed in clearly legible and contrasting font.
- There are few glass doors without safety markings.
- An outgoing emergency call in the elevator is confirmed audibly. The stopping position is not announced by spoken commands. The control elements are not visually rich in contrast but tactilely detectable.
- Steps are not visually rich in contrast.
- Stairs have at least a handrail on one side.
- The exhibits are usually well illuminated.
- The information on the exhibits is predominatel provided in written form and is visually rich in contrast.
- Guided tours are offered for people with visual impairments and for blind people. A reservation in advance is necessary.
- Information is not available in Braille or prismatic writing.

Information for guests with cognitive impairments

Some **information on accessibility** are listed below. For detailed information please see the evaluation report.

- The name or logo of the establishment / facility is clearly recognizable from the outside.
- The destination of the paths are within sight. Besides that there are signs at a visible distance or an uninterrupted guidance system.
- There is no colored or pictorial guidance system.
- The information on the exhibits is provided in written form, but not in easy language.
- There are no guided tours offered for people with cognitive impairments.

Comfort for all generations

We have compiled some **information on accessibility** below. Detailed information can be found in the test report.

- There are public parking spaces in the Anger 1 parking garage (approx. 300 m) or at Forum 1 (approx. 200 m).
- The Anger streetcar stop is 40 m away (all lines).
- The path in front of the entrance is easily accessible.
- The building is accessible without steps.
- The entrance is visually contrasting. The name and logo of the museum are clearly recognizable from the outside.
- All rooms and facilities that can be used and elevated for guests are accessible without steps/at ground level or via an elevator.
- The elevator car is 116 cm x 215 cm.
- Almost all doors/passages usable and elevated by the guest are at least 88 cm wide.
- The counter/cash register is 92 cm high at the lowest point.
- Guided tours are offered for people with walking disabilities, hearing disabilities and visual disabilities. The entire route of the tour is step-free. Advance reservation is required.
- There is no visually distinct alarm.
- There is no inductive hearing system.
- An outgoing emergency call in the elevator is audibly acknowledged. Alternatively, there are stairs. Stair treads are not visually contrasting. Stairs have at least one handrail on one side.
- Exhibit information is provided in writing. Signage designed in legible, high-contrast lettering.
- There are occasional glass doors without safety markings.
- Exhibits are generally well lit.

•	Trail destinations are in plain sight. There are also wayfinding signs at visible intervals or an uninterrupted wayfinding system.

Information on the "Tourism for All" labeling system

All establishments and locations certified with the label "Tourism for All" meet the following quality criteria:

- Data and information on accessibility are collected and checked on site by **external**, **specially trained evaluators**. The method is not based on self-assessments.
- Data on accessibility is available **in detail** and can be viewed by the guests.
- At least one staff member has successfully passed a **training** on "**Accessibility as a comfort and quality feature**".

The labeling - explanation of the logos and pictograms

The label "Information about Accessibility" indicates that detailed and verified information on accessibility is available for all groups of people.

The label "Accessibility certified" is based on "Information about Accessibility". It means that the quality criteria defined for specific groups of people are met partially or completely.



Accessibility certified



The label "Accessibility certified" is available in two requirement levels:

"Accessibility certified: partially accessible".

The quality criteria are partially fulfilled for the pictured group of people, i.e. the establishment/location is partially accessible for wheelchair users. The "i" in the pictogram indicates that it is recommended to read again carefully whether the offer meets all (your oder the guest's) individual requirements.



"Accessibility certified: accessible".

The quality criteria are fulfilled for the pictured group of people, i.e. the establishment/location is accessible for wheelchair users.

There are defined quality criteria for **seven groups of people** and a **specific pictogram** for each group.
